Caverswerk (Derbyshire) Meet. Sat/Sun 8th/9th June 1963.

The wet conditions came as rather a surprise. G.S. took photographs. We failed to locate from the inside a ladder dropped down Eynam Dale Shaft; G.S. passing within 2 feet of the end of it, so we returned the long way and afterwards descended the ladder and found where it does in fact emerge. Next day, four of us (G.S. RKM. ALF. + BRW) visited Lathkill House Cave. Here the height of the water in the stream passage prevented access to the upper chambers. Next, G.S. + RKM. visited two other scratches - Critchlow Cavern and Lower Caledale Cave: we stayed overnight at Magpie Cottage, belonging to Peak District Mines Historical Society.

Cave Rescue Practice in Lamb Hole. Sun. 16th June 1963.

Dr. Oliver Lloyd volunteered to be victim and the practice was supervised in its initial stages by Mike Thompson. Owing to a late start, we decided to finish after raising the body up the big pitch, having started in the cave of Falling Waters. Quite a lot was learned, but a certain amount of co-ordination was lacking as no one took the initiative to be leader, & decisions were reached by discussion. Even if most members gained little useful knowledge, they will now be more appreciative of the work done by rescue teams, and for this reason, I feel that such mock rescues are ~~go~~ an essential part of a caver's experience. With changing membership, it is difficult to organise a team, & it is significant that only one of the members present on the last rescue practice (Feb 18th 1962), was present on this one (q.s.). After leaving the cave, a bag of tackle was found ^{to be} missing and 3 of us descended and waded up the big pitch (q.s. P.C. Oct) and the bag was found at the bottom of the pitch.

On the first evening, after arrival, G.S. & R.K.M. visited a newly discovered E. section of Cwm Dwt cave called Cwm Dwt Tama. Before the breakthrough, the cave has an estimated value of about 7/- a foot in explosives (2-300'!!) The new extension is a wonderful place & is easily reached, tho' low but safe flooded passages. The next day the same party visited Tunnel cave & successfully bottomed it, reaching the grating & feeling frustrated at this man-made barrier necessitating a return up the 400' of vertical ascent to the upper entrance. The next day, Pant Mawr was descended, & the final sump was backed up making the last 100' of cave a deep lake that was not crossed. After a day off, the party of 4 set off for Tunnel cave again and after descending the entrance pitch and steepest slopes - split into two parties G.S. & R.K.M. visited the East leg passages whilst M.J.W. & R.E.S. went down to the grating & returned. The following day, M.J.W. & R.E.S. left Penwyllt, & G.S. & R.K.M. on a day off, visited FFynnon Ddu, the rising of the Ogof or also Powell's Cave, a short two' cave on the R. of the road up to Penwyllt. This was done without lights!! - very intrepid! On the Sat., G.S. & R.K.M. went to the Southern General Meeting of the Cave Research Group of G.B. in Brecon.
